COMMITTEE REPORTS

MAYOR: Mayor Joseph Shay preformed two weddings last month.

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MOUNT GRETNA FIRE COMPANY: The December Fire Company report was read by Mayor Shay. A copy was emailed to Council members prior to the meeting and is attached and heretofore made part of the minutes.

SOLICITOR: Solicitor Kilgore presented the Foundation's application, prepared by HRG Engineering, for construct of a crosswalk over route #117 connecting the proposed parking area with Mount Gretna Borough. Michael Bell made a motion to approve the application, seconded by Robert Eynon. All were in favor.

ROADS AND STREETS: Mr. Care gave the following report:

<u>Snow Removal</u>: The predicted weekend snow storm is for several inches of snow. All equipment is working well.

<u>Street Paving:</u> We are planning on paving this summer or fall.

<u>Speed Bump</u>: Per comment by Tom Cook, resident of 401 Lancaster Avenue, requesting that Borough Council considered installing speed bumps/restrictors on Lancaster and Lehigh Avenues, Council discussed the issue of restricting speed on Borough streets. Mr. Care expressed concern that speed bumps can be detrimental to snow removal equipment.

Council requested that Mr. Care secure estimates for the installation of a speed bump.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

<u>102 Muhlenberg Avenue</u>: The property located at 102 Muhlenberg Avenue was inspected by ABI. However, a building permit was never submitted. A building permit is required; therefore, a permit application must be submitted. An application was emailed to the property owner but there has been no response as of this date. A reminder of the requirements was sent today. If no response, a notice of violation will be sent.

<u>Pennsylvania Chautauqua</u>: Allan Feldman stated that the PA Chautauqua will meeting on Wednesday evening.
